The Word on the (F) Street

Progressive Insurance has had a great run with their commercials that highlight how **not** to be like your parents. They feature "Dr Rick," who helps young home buyers in this endeavor. Most of the advice is funny, and maybe even good, until recently. In his commercial titled, "voice mail," he corrects Julie for calling and leaving him a voice mail, and states, "9 out of 10 times a text will do." WRONG!

Texting is great for passing a quick note or reminder, like we use to pass notes in class. However, they are horrible for building a relationship or really getting to know others. Our world lacks personal connection, and

with spiritual concerns and corrections, texting is horrible.

Now let me be honest: we likely have all done this, and I am included. But with no intentions of pointing the finger at anyone, I have had more interpersonal conflicts because people texted a concern to someone, and it came across as rude, or judgmental. The sender of the text often meant to communicate a concern of deep care. Of course, the responses have not often been much better when we feel we have been wrongly accused or judged. The wedge of division and hurt is now dug in and friends, a moment ago, are potentially forever separated by the send button.

Can we, as a community, work to, "Love, carry the burden, admonish, be kind, live in harmony, comfort, care, encourage..." less by text, and more through sitting down with someone? Remember that James tells us, "..my dear brothers and sisters: You must all be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to get angry." James 1:19

A few thoughts to consider:

- Never assume you understood the meaning of the text. Call to clarify
- What could be said in a text, but would be better in person? Stop before texting and consider better options
- Don't make quick responses of any kind. Take time to pray and calm down before calling back. Maybe ask someone else to read the text and help you consider a healthy response.
- Sometimes if someone is simply going off in texts, and unwilling to have a healthy conversation there may be a time to simply block the person.

Monthly Bible Reading Schedule: Jeff Heerspink, Pastor

Well, here we are again, at the beginning of a new year. Time for new-year resolutions and goals. I always think that it is a good time to make some changes as well, and this year am working on a "Rule of Life" (you can google "Rule of Life John Mark Comer" and find a great worksheet for doing this). Yet few choices and changes can be as important as being in the word of God.

The Bible is the only offensive weapon we are given in the spiritual armor (Ephesians 6:17) and is stated to be sharper than any two -edged sword (Hebrews 4:12). It is the light for our feet and the lamp on the path to guide us (Psalm 119:105). Those who delight in the word of God and meditate on it, are like a tree planted by the waters edge always fruitful, strong and full (Psalm 1).

I really want to encourage you this year to put together a plan ... some kind of plan to be in God's Word. This year I will be putting a Bible reading plan on the back of the F Street Church Newsletter, that will help to direct you through the New Testament.
