The Word on the (F) Street

CPR Jeff Heerspink, Pastor

CPR is the life - saving training that many of us have had at some point in our lives. However, I am wanting to discuss a different CPR, also lifesaving and life giving, standing for Cultivate, Plant, and Reap. Paul used a similar concept in 1 Corinthians 3:6-11 speaking of him planting the seeds, Apollos watering them, and God causing them to grow.

This is a term that I heard a lot in youth ministry, as we talked about evangelism or the privilege to share the gospel with others. Keep in mind it is a privilege to be used by God to share the hope and the joy of his message. CPR is a thoughtful process of how to do that.

It begins with <u>cultivating the relationship</u>: Relationships are the most powerful tool we have to share the gospel with others. It is also one of the lost arts of our culture, to establish true, authentic, loving relationships. But

ment (meals, time, rides, learning from them and about them) before we can share the hope that we have.

<u>Planting the seed</u>: planting can be as simple as sharing the hope that you have in Jesus. It can also be inviting this friend to church, to a bible study, to CR. Or it can be sharing with them the gospel message. Maybe that is overwhelming to you, to help we have created a pamphlet that is on the back table of the church that helps to lay out the gospel. You can use this as you share the gospel or as a learning tool to equip yourself to share the gospel.

Reaping the harvest: As noted in the 1 Corinthians passage, there is a need for us to trust God to make it grow. God is the one who opens hearts and calls people to himself, but he uses us to be a part of that journey. Pray to God for the wisdom of who, how and when to call people to believe. Sometimes we can be friends for a long time and suddenly they open up or a tragedy strikes and we are there as a friend to share Jesus.

This is not a magic formula, and people are not ponds to build relationships with only to share Jesus. We are called to build deep authentic loving relationships with the sinners..the lost, and we should be willing and able to share the hope that we have with them as we love them and want them to know Jesus. CPR is about saving lives physically and spiritually. We should stay in the relationship because we love, even when they decline the first time and the fiftieth time as we love them. In fact, there are times when I am convinced that Jesus has called us to simply be there with them regardless as faithful followers of Jesus.

Youth Update Sage Peterson, Youth Director

For a while now I have had a note card that sits on my desk that has some statistics that I happened to find. The notecard starts off by saying that 75% of kids have left the church from ages 18-29, and the other 25% have stayed connected to the church. Now if you are thinking like me, those numbers are astonishing! I don't know where these numbers were pulled



from, so take them with a little grain of salt. I do believe that they aren't that far off. What really stands out to me, from these numbers, is that it proves how formidable and important these years are before students leave the house. As a church, our goal is to raise up the next generation of believers, and expand God's kingdom. Being a youth leader, I love the time spent with all students, and to try and make a positive impact in the lives of each one that walks through the door. But the problem is, our youth staff are limited in their ability to do just that, and only have a short amount of time. For example, if your student comes to youth group every week during the school year, it amounts to 54 hours over the entire year. As a parent, you see your student every day. I recognize sometimes with teens that can mean 20 minutes, but you as a parent truly are the biggest influence in your kid's life!

Now back to the stats that I was talking about earlier. It went on to explain that of the 25% that stayed in the church they contributed it to five things:

- These students ate dinner 5 of 7 nights a week as a family
- They served in the church and community with their family
- Each week they had a spiritual experience in the home
- They were entrusted in ministry at a young age
- Had AT LEAST one faith-focused adult outside of their parents

The goal of sharing these numbers with you is not to try and call out anyone, but instead help and provide all parents with resources to better their families. Oftentimes we hear "youth" or "kids ministry" but in reality what that means is "family ministry," because all of you as parents are at the forefront of our ministries just as much as the kids are.

I understand that with kids and busy schedules, it can be hard to fit some of these activities, in but I encourage you to focus on just one and see how that may work in your household. If you as a parent have any questions or are maybe in need of some support I encourage you to reach out to myself (Sage Peterson - youth) or any other kids ministry lead (Willow Applegate - youth, Hollie Sell - 3rd-5th, Marcia Thornton - K-3rd, and Tami Thornton - Nursery) and we would love to walk with you through this season of life.
