

Why Does F Street Have an Art Chapel?

If you've been around F Street for awhile, you know we've been working on the Art Chapel for a few years. On Friday, May 16, we passed our final inspection by the Dept. of Building & Safety. Our bright, colorful, airy space is officially legal for public use! But why did we build this thing, and what are we going to do with it?

When the Lord told the people of Israel to build a place of worship, he commanded them to make it beautiful, filled with all sorts of lovely furnishings.




The instructions were detailed and elaborate, and the workmanship was to be excellent. God cares about creativity and beauty, and he made us to respond to those things. When we enter a beautiful space, it elevates our soul, and the act of creating can do this as well. Science tells us that when we engage in creative activities, the level of cortisol (a stress hormone) in our bodies drops profoundly. Creativity makes space for joy and peace in a person's inner world.

The Art Chapel is a place where we can learn to be artistically playful again. We've set aside this space for folks to rediscover the joys of making, to find a community, and learn to integrate faith and creativity. We offer Monday Night Open Studio, where anyone can come and use our supplies or bring their own project to work in community in our friendly environment. We make art with the residents of CenterPointe every week. We're hosting Saturday classes, Block Party activities, and a family camp. We will host monthly Worship Nights throughout the summer. Our schedule is constantly evolving as we learn what works for our neighborhood! Keep an eye on our offerings at artchapellnk.org.

Ultimately, the Art Chapel exists to be a place of acceptance and direction. Our mission is to use the arts as a means to serve our community and invite them to know Jesus. Creative people will find a place to belong at the Art Chapel. As their hearts are softened by seeing and making beauty, they become able to hear about and receive our savior's love.

In the future, we hope to see a large variety of people from our F Street family contributing to the life of the Art Chapel. The Practice of Community with One Another

During the months of May and June Pastors Jeff, RJ and I are spending time on Sunday mornings teaching our F Street Church family from some of the One Another passages in the Bible.

In addition, you may recall that a few months ago I began a series of articles for our church newsletter that is inspired by a book I read recently entitled Practicing the Way, written by John Mark Comer. My intention in writing these pieces has been to encourage us to consider implementing what he calls the "The Nine" into our habits of daily life.

Today I would like to take a few moments for us to consider the practice of Community which provides the relational context for the application of these One Another principles. Comer states...

"...We simply are not meant to follow Jesus alone.

The radical individualism of Western culture
is not only a mental health crisis and growing, social catastrophe,
it's a death blow to any kind of serious formation into Christlike love.
Because it's in relationships that we are formed and forged."

Some of you may be wondering, what are some practical ways that we can begin to do this?

I'm glad you asked that question! Here are some suggestions as to how we can foster healthy relationships, build positive community, and develop a greater likeness to Jesus Christ in the process:

Participate in one of our community groups (Bible studies).
Intercede with/for others at our weekly prayer meeting.
Work on hurts, habits and hangups at Celebrate Recovery.
Volunteer to serve on one of our ministry teams.
Check out opportunities in the neighborhood with
Transformed Life Coaching or Atlas Lincoln.

As I sign off this month, I want to invite you to consider what might be your next step in terms of growing deeper in community with God and others through F Street Neighborhood Church. I can tell you that taking a step into community has the potential of impacting not only your life, but also the lives of others. Let's do it!

Multiply Churches

What Wings Are to a Bird

Corrie ten Boom coined the famous quote: "What wings are to a bird, and sails are to a ship, so is prayer to the soul." Perhaps we are like birds without wings and ships without sails when we do not pray. Perhaps we rob ourselves of a life lived fully when we do not come to God with the cries of our hearts.

When we do pray, we are speaking directly with the Creator of the universe. Rather than letting this intimidate us, may we let it remind us that no matter where we are, we can pray with confidence that He hears us and cares about what we have to say (1 John 5:14).

At F Street, our prayer team believes in the power of connecting with the One who has the power to make streams flow in the desert. At the end of every service, prayer team members are available to share the gift of praying to the Father with anyone that needs it. 

We Need a Van?

When F Street Church started, we had no plans for a Transportation Team or vans. We were simply here in the neighborhood with the intent to serve and share the gospel message of Jesus.

Then came Immerse. For one Immerse group, we borrowed a van from our friends at Northern Lighthouse—affectionately called the "Rust Bucket." It was a sort of 15-passenger van meets Flintstones, where you could literally see the road through holes in the floor. One leader from that group took it upon himself to raise funds and find us a van that was not only safe but could serve the church year-round—and the Transportation Team was born.

Later, another supporter of F Street donated a minivan, which has been put to good use on Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights for Celebrate Recovery, helping people get to church and CR. In addition, the vans are used for F Street shopping runs, youth events, and other church-related activities.

Now, we're hoping to add to our Transportation Team by getting another 12- or 15-passenger van. The minivan is, well, too mini—and we need to fit more people. It also has some mechanical issues that, while not unsafe, do leave people wondering, "Will we make it?"

So we're starting a van fund, hoping to raise enough money to purchase a used 12- or 15-passenger van. Our early estimates are around \$20,000.

As with other giving opportunities at F Street, this is all about helping us share the gospel—making it more accessible to people who do not own their own vehicles.

You can give by placing your donation in an envelope marked "Van," writing "Van" in the memo line of your check, or giving online under the new van fund designation.

Our semester finished on May 3 with many meaningful end-of-year festivities, including graduation. It was with joy that we recognized and sent-off another set of graduates. Many of them had regularly participated in our home Bible study. They will be missed.

One student was the first to graduate with a Concentration in Michelle's Environmental Literacy and Sustainability program. Beginning in Fall 2025, LCC will now offer this program as an EUrecognized micro-credential certification. This is a significant milestone for us!

Despite completing the academic year and graduation, our work continues. We hope to slow down a little bit in a few weeks. Here are a few things we've been working on since graduation:

- AJ continues to wrap up his term as Director of Residence Life and pass it on to the new
 teammate. He will then be able to step fully in as the VP of Student Life. Please pray for wisdom,
 vision, and strong leadership in this role.

Some upcoming highlights:

- Next week we go to Poland for a sustainability conference in which Michelle will participate. Please pray for good connections, conversations, and ideas to come from that time.
- After that, 1 more week in Klaipeda. Please pray for all of us in this season of transition and preparation.
- And then, 1 week in Oregon for AJ's annual Christian Student Development conference. Please pray for fruit from that time.
- From there, we head to Nebraska for a few weeks of family time and reconnecting with many of you. We look forward to time spent together, and time spent away from our work and ministry here.
