The benevolence program here at F Street has been a blessing to many struggling people and families in our community. My heart is blessed by witnessing the gratitude that pours out from some of the folks who receive help.

Some other recipients are not so grateful, and at times I find it hard not to develop sour feelings toward certain individuals. I wonder how folks find the nerve to complain about the dollar amount on a gas voucher when they're getting it for free. I'm sure you, the reader, can relate to that sort of contempt, especially if you're one of the "givers". However, God has been gracious to remind me (and hopefully you, if you need it) that the response others give is not what we give for.

There are several things that could be unpacked here, but for now I want to stick to the truth that scripture reminds us of frequently as followers of Christ: that we are to give freely and cheerfully (Matthew 10:8 and 2 Corin 9:7). Do those verses say anything about giving freely and cheerfully unless the recipient doesn't act right? Or unless the recipient is ungrateful? No, we are not given conditions for the extent to which we may give to others. After all, if Jesus only brought salvation to those who are never ungrateful, I'd venture to guess that none of us would be eligible to receive that great Gift.

The truth is, sitting here writing this, I am guilty of being ungrateful to God for that which He's given to me. Thinking that some folks don't deserve F Street's help just adds salt to my self-inflicted wound.

Thank you, Lord for freely giving to us, that we may also freely give. Let me look up at You always, and follow your commands that You might do Your work in spite of me.

Called Because of God

To be called by God is a fascinating reality. That God would call you and I to do anything is incredible. After all, who am I, who are you, who are we to do much of anything? Paul seems to agree when he writes:

"Remember, dear brothers and sisters, that few of you were wise in the world's eyes or powerful or wealthy when God called you. ²⁷ Instead, God chose things the world considers foolish in order to shame those who think they are wise. And he chose things that are powerless to shame those who are powerful. ²⁸ God chose things despised by the world, things counted as nothing at all, and used them to bring to nothing what the world considers important. ²⁹ As a result, no one can ever boast in the presence of God." - 1 Corinthians 1:26-29

This is what God does, he calls us who are not the wisest, not the most powerful or wealthy, to display his hope and his glory. I think it also is important that Paul makes it clear this is how the world sees us, not God. No, God sees us in our desperate state before salvation, but he also sees us as his children, his masterpieces. He equips us with every spiritual blessing and gives us spiritual gifts to be used (see Ephesians 1:3-10).

The question is not if we are called, but are we living into that Calling? Are we using our gifts, are we using our spiritual blessings to build the church into maturity? Are we using our gifts to serve others? You may remember a few weeks ago when I got pretty fired up in the sermon when preaching on 1 Peter 4:10: "God has given each of you a gift from his great variety of spiritual gifts. Use them well to serve one another." I long to see the church (F Street and universal) be where there is a high level of people who are using their gifts to serve in a variety of ways.

<u>Do you want to know what your spiritual gifts are?</u> Then come and talk to Pastor Jeff or reach out (402-805-2667 or email at jeff@fstreetchurch.org) to get a SHAPE packet that looks at your Spiritual gifts, Heart (Passions), Abilities, Personality and Experiences. This can be a great way to know yourself and to be known, as well as getting you plugged into ministries.



8/1/25 - The Walhaf's

Occasionally in the past five years, a visitor will say something along the lines of, "I just don't know how you can do it." They might be referring to practicing medicine in a resource-limited setting; teaching at a professional school where English is not a first (or second) language; being on call 50% or more of nights; homeschooling while working full time. We might reply (depending on the day):

- We don't do it alone; we have a great community and teams (in Kenya/East Africa, and supporting us from North America) who hold us up.
- We depend on our faith and prayers to carry us through.
- Some days, neither do we!

But the truth is - most days, just like most people, we're probably too dependent on our own strength, experience, knowledge, and abilities. Most days, we probably feel like we could get by, with or without our co-workers, community, or God. Most days, when things don't go well, we probably feel like if we just tried harder, worked a little longer, were a little smarter, the outcomes could have been different.

A saving grace of the lives we live here is getting to experience living right at - or just beyond - our own abilities. As I have said to many visitors, every day I pray for good outcomes for my patients. I genuinely want the best possible outcome for them - I hope all physicians want that for their patients.

I love the Gettys, and I love this re-write of a old hymn from the early 1900s. When my faith isn't enough to believe that God is good despite all the sadness and suffering in the world, I borrow the words of the father in Mark 9: "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!"
