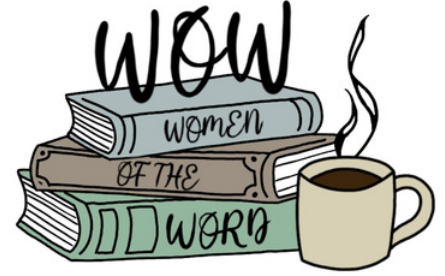
Some of the team were able to gather and wrap gifts on a December Saturday and had a blast celebrating the success God gave us with this program for the year!

Yet it is set in dark times: the final verse of the book of Judges, which precedes Ruth in the Bible, tells us that 'in those days there was no king in Israel. Everyone did what was right in his own eyes.' As one commentator writes, the time was marked by 'violent invasions, apostate religion, unchecked lawlessness, and tribal civil war.'

Against this backdrop of strife and chaos, Ruth is a story of ordinary people in Bethlehem making the most of their bad situation—and finding God in the midst of it. Alistair Begg reminds us that no matter how dark or dramatic our days may seem, God still protects His people and accomplishes His purposes. Within life's humdrum and routine events, we discover His loving hand at work."

This month, we are beginning a new sermon series from the book of Matthew, "Building on the Rock: Learning to Live Wisely with Jesus." This title, drawn from Matthew 7, immediately brings to mind an image of a little house built on a rock, hunkering down against a battering storm. When you think about building a life of wisdom that's well-grounded and won't be shaken by the storms of life, what images come to mind?

Starting January 4, we'll have a "tree of life" artwork under construction on the stage. As you watch the tree take shape over the weeks, consider the ways trees are used throughout scripture to illustrate strength, prosperity, growth, shelter, etc. Ask the Lord to show you how he wants to shape your life to be steadfast and faithful. Consider what things you can do to become "like trees planted along the riverbank, bearing fruit each season. Their leaves never wither, and they prosper in all they do." Psalm 1:3

## 1926 - 2026

Several cool and notable things happened in 1926. The first liquid-fueled rocket was launched. Marilyn Monroe was born. Harry Houdini died. Those are notable, but what matters most to us is that a small church, begun in 1873, had grown enough to build its fourth church building in just 50 years.

Our first building—now known as the Art Chapel—was built in 1873 on land given by the State of Nebraska to help establish churches around the new State Capital. The simple 36x20 structure cost \$600 to build, and recent renovations revealed reminders that early builders truly “built with what they had.”

By 1896, the church—then called St. Paul’s Evangelical Church—built a second church with a parsonage in the rear. The original building was moved and repurposed as a schoolhouse and later caretaker’s quarters. In 1905, further renovation and a brick veneer created what was considered the third church building.

In 1921, a fund was started for a new church at 13th and F. Once \$30,000 was secured, in 1925, construction began with the plan to spend no more than \$70,000. The cornerstone was laid on November 8, 1925. Services were first held in the basement on Easter of 1926, and on June 27 of that year, the first service was held in what we now know as F Street Neighborhood Church.

As Mel Schroder has said, “The Word of God has been preached on the corner of 13th and F for over 150 years.” We are blessed to be a small part of God’s ongoing story in this building located in this great neighborhood.
