1926 - 2026

A few years ago, someone came to my home in need of a jacket. I walked with him to the church to find something from our supply in the back of the church. I remember that walk vividly, but even more so, what happened when we stepped inside.

As we entered through the side doors, we were both caught off guard by an overwhelming display of light streaming through the stained-glass windows. The setting sun illuminated the sanctuary in a way I had rarely seen before. It was breathtaking. Though I had spent many hours in that space, this moment felt different, almost as if everything had aligned perfectly. The beauty of the light seemed to point unmistakably to the living, resurrected Jesus.

The man with me seemed to sense it, too. Instead of focusing on the jacket he needed, his attention turned toward repentance. He moved to the front of the sanctuary, knelt, and wept, remaining there until the sun had fully set.

Surprisingly, little is known about the windows' origins. Mel Schroeder, a lifelong attendee of the churches at 13th and F, has shared that they came from Italy. While that is likely true, it's remarkable that as we approach the 100th anniversary of this beautiful building, so much about these windows remains unknown.

What we do have are a few glimpses into their history. A 1926 article in the Lincoln Star described the building as having "a number of lovely memorial art glass windows." In the dedication booklet from June 27, 1926, we read: "The Auditorium is well lighted through beautiful art glass windows, the larger of which contain such figures as Birth of Christ, Ascension, The Good Shepherd, Come Unto Me, Resurrection, all of which were presented as memorials."

It appears their history is a mystery, yet His story they tell is no mystery; they portray a wonderful telling of the life of Jesus and have awed and inspired many. May we find joy in His stories they tell and the opportunity to bask in His light they display.



Healing Through Relationship

There is good science suggesting the best way to heal trauma from our childhood is not to isolate or avoid relationships as adults, but rather to embrace relationships. Here's how it can work:

Attachment theory suggests that a lack of healthy attachments or relationships in childhood can lead to fear, anxiety, or any number of insecure attachments/relationships in your adult life. Some people desire attachment so much that they will accept abuse from others just to stay in a relationship with someone...anyone. Others seek control because things felt so out of control growing up. Others may seek to numb themselves with substances, recognition, or whatever else might numb their pain. All of us have wounds we bring into relationships that are buried deep in our past. We carry them into our adult lives. Sometimes they're visible to those around us, and sometimes they're not, but either way, because of Christ, we don't have to stay stuck and afraid.

Maybe some of you can see where this is going, but a church community is the best place to find healing through relationships. Dr. Dan Siegel, who is a pioneer in the field of "Interpersonal Neurobiology," which is just a fancy term referring to the study of how relationships shape us, said, "The cultural lie that's killing us is to think that we're each a separate self that doesn't need to help and interact with other people. We need to identify who we are in our relationships, not just in our inner life."

God created us for relationships. The most important of which is our relationship with him, as well as our daily focus on Jesus. Our relationship with Christ is healing us as he compels us toward love of others through healthy relationships. 1 John 4:18-19 says, "Such love has no fear, because perfect love expels all fear. If we are afraid, it is for fear of punishment, and this shows that we have not fully experienced his perfect love. We love each other because he loved us first (NLT)." Whether this is done through CR, small groups, or simply sharing a meal with your church family, God uses our relationships to teach us and to help us heal.

Do We Have Deacons at F Street?

A few weeks ago, I was in a conversation with someone who made the comment that we do not have Deacons at F Street. I responded by saying that we do, we simply call them Team Leaders.

Biblically, the role of Deacons can be understood through several key areas of responsibility: stewardship, benevolence, justice, and community. One of the clearest pictures of this is found in Acts 6:1–7. In this passage, some widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution of food, an issue of fairness and care. In response, the apostles instructed the church to select seven men who were well respected and full of the Spirit and wisdom to ensure that these needs were met.

This is important because it shows us that Deacons were not simply responsible for finances or facilities; they were entrusted with ministry. They helped make sure people were cared for, needs were met, and the mission of the church moved forward.

At F Street, we embrace this same vision. We believe that those who oversee ministry areas and lead teams that support our mission of being a place of acceptance and direction are functioning in the role of Deacons. While we may use the title “Team Leader,” the heart of the role remains the same.

These leaders are expected to meet the biblical qualifications found in 1 Timothy 3:8–13, and they serve by leading teams that actively minister to others both within the church and in our community.

The farm is presently home to a solid tribe of goats and plenty of space to grow and explore what God might be calling us to.

While plans and potential are numerous and plentiful, Rich is currently growing vegetable and flower seedlings to plant once it’s safe weather-wise to do so. Starting “small” is the aim for F Street Farm, meaning our focus for this year will be plants and poultry, potentially things that can be sold for the farm to become self-sustaining from the get-go.

The heart behind the ministry is the people it will give new opportunities to. The dream is to provide a place for folks to experience what the love of Jesus can do for a soul through working on a farm. Rich believes that through working hard with one’s hands, especially outdoors, God can do a great work in the heart, soul, mind, body, and spirit. Since we are a church with a heart for helping people heal from addiction and other strongholds, we anticipate and hope that this can bring major change to the people who need it the most.



There will be opportunities aplenty for all who want to help and serve. There could be so much more said about what we are hoping for, but for now, PRAY for this ministry. Church Planting

Two years ago, we gathered for a Family Meeting (Congregation Meeting) to prayerfully consider the possibility of purchasing the former City Light building on O Street. After much prayer and discernment, we chose not to move forward, primarily because we did not yet have the pastoral leadership needed to sustain that step.

Today, that discernment continues. We remain committed to prayerfully pursuing the planting of new churches that carry the DNA of F Street, Churches that love as Christ loved, especially the lost and hurting, and that are firmly rooted in Scripture. Churches that are moving into the places where others are leaving. These churches will live out the vision of Acceptance and Direction: welcoming all while faithfully pointing people to Jesus.

A significant part of this work is raising leaders. We are investing intentionally in residency programs, giving individuals a year or more to grow, be discipled, and be equipped. Our hope is to send leaders out in teams, planting two-by-two, as they step into new communities.

We are looking and praying for the right location. There are several potential locations in and around Lincoln that we are exploring, and we trust that God will make His direction clear in His timing.

As Jesus instructs in Luke 10:2: "The harvest is great, but the workers are few. So pray to the Lord who is in charge of the harvest; ask him to send more workers into his fields." Would you join us in praying for workers?

And please know, I would love to talk more with you at any time if you're interested in learning more or getting involved.
